DEFINITION OF HANDICAP AND DISABILITY

- b. <u>Handicapped</u> means a person having a physical or mental impairment which: (1) is expected to be of long or indefinite duration; (2) substantially impedes his or her ability to live independently; and (3) is of such a nature that the person's ability to live independently could be improved by more suitable housing conditions.
- c. <u>Disabled</u> refers to a person who is under a disability as defined in Section 223 of the Social Services Act or in Section 102 (b) (5) of the Developmental Disabilities Services and Facilities Construction Amendments of 1970. Receipt of veteran's benefits for disability, whether service-oriented or otherwise, does not automatically establish disability. <u>The Owner must make the determination based upon his/her evaluation of the applicant's condition.</u>
 - (1) Section 223 of the Social Security Act defines disability as:
 - (a) "Inability to engage in any substantial gainful activity by reason of any medically determinable physical or mental impairment which can be expected to last for a continuous period of not less than 12 months; or
 - (b) In the case of an individual who has attained the age of 55 and is blind (within the meaning of "blindness" as defined in Section 416 (i) (1) of this title), inability by reason of such blindness to engage in substantial gainful activity requiring skills or abilities comparable to those of any gainful activity in which he has previously engaged with some regularity and over a substantial period of time."
 - (2) Section 102 (b) (5) of the Developmental Disabilities Services and Facilities Construction Amendments of 1970 defines disability as:

"A disability attributable to mental retardation, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, or another neurological condition of an individual found by the Secretary (of Health and Human Services) to be closely related to mental retardation or to require treatment similar to that required for mentally retarded individuals, which disability originates before such individual attains age eighteen, which has continued or can be expected to continue indefinitely, and which constitutes a substantial handicap to such individual."
